Dragons and Creatures 2

The unicorn is one of the most beautiful mythical creatures in history. In Kazakhstan, the unicorn is more than just a myth! Scientists are studying an animal called the **Siberian unicorn** that lived in Kazakhstan thousands of years ago! The Siberian unicorn was 1.8 metres tall, over 4 metres long and weighed more than 4 tonnes! It had long hair

all over its body. The Siberian unicorn got its name from the huge horn over 2 metres long - that grew on its head! What a cool creature!

The Loch Ness Monster or Nessie is a strange creature. Some people believe it lives in a lake called Loch Ness in Scotland. They think Nessie is grey with a big body, a long neck and a small head. Many people often visit Loch Ness. They hope to spot Nessie! Scientists also explore the lake to try and find out what there really is under the water. Is it a dinosaur from millions of years ago? Is it a dragon that can swim well?
